#### **ID BADGE POLICY**

#### The Celebration Residential Owners Association (CROA) Board approved the following resolution to the current ID Badge policy:

A passholder may bring no more than four non-resident guests outside of their immediate family on any given occasion unless under a scheduled event, private party, etc. The passholder must remain with the guest(s) at all times. In order to avoid conflicts or disappointments, please contact Town Hall if you are having a party in one of the parks or playgrounds.

#### **HOA ASSESSMENTS**

Celebration Residential Owners Association assessments are due on the first day of every January, April, July and October. After the last business day of those months, payments not posted to accounts will begin to accrue late lees and interest. Please allow 10 business days for mailing and processing. Statements are mailed out 30 days prior to the due date. 





# CELEBRATION COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT



Certain times of the year, we seem to notice more algae, duckweed and other nuisance plants in the ponds. Some ponds seem to be fine, while others are not as pretty. Part of the reason for this growth is warm weather and lack of rainfall. Rain helps flush the ponds and reduces the visibility of nuisance plants. The age of a pond is also a factor, since more mature ponds have fewer problems and generally look nicer throughout the year.

The Celebration CDD is responsible for managing and controlling the aquatic weeds within the ponds and canals. Sitex Aquatics performs these maintenance functions as the District's aquatics contractor. Maintenance includes any of the following: hand removal, grass carp, plant material to help absorb the excess nutrients in the pond, and chemical treatments as needed. All the ponds are interconnected and subject to various governmental permits (such as South Florida Water Management District or Osceola County), which control and regulate certain kinds of treatments and how frequently chemicals can be applied.

One of the biggest contributors causing algae and other noxious weeds in the ponds is grass clippings and excess fertilizer that wash into these ponds. We ask residents to assist in this maintenance effort through the following suggestions:

- Do not fertilize the pond or lake or apply fertilizers closer than 20 feet from the shoreline
- Do not blow lawn clippings or other plant material into the ponds or into the street where it can run through the drainage system

# THE HOLIDAYS ARE COMING

The holidays are coming. The holidays are coming. Much like Paul Revere made similar announcements about an impending approach by the British Army, I am sending out a loud and clear announcement, a warning if you will, that the holidays are coming. Why a warning about the holidays? Well, the approach of the holidays mean another sort of invasion, the invasion of thieves and criminals. Just as Mr. Revere's warning was meant to protect the townspeople, I want to warn you of the approaching perils of the holiday season.

The information I provide to you is truthful, so I hope you heed warnings and take appropriate actions to help avoid being a victim of a crime, especially during the holiday season. Does crime increase around the holidays? Yes and no. According to reports from the National Crime Victimization Survey (NCVS), two specific types of crime increase in December: robbery and theft of property.

Thousands of deliveries made in Celebration alone on a weekly, or daily basis, make for loads of opportunity for someone seeking easy targets. Now add in the additional visitors to drive around looking at decorations, shopping, dining or just visiting with families. All the extra people coming into town, along with those delivered parcels at your doorsteps make for the easy opportunity criminals desire.

That's just for theft. Now lets consider all the gifts, purchases and purses left visible and sitting in vehicles. Add to that, the often unlocked cars with the key fobs left inside them. Easy targets, right? You may laugh, but this has happened in Celebration on several occasions.

#### **HOME SAFETY TIPS**

- Call the Sheriff's Office or your local police immediately if you see suspicious vehicles or persons around your home or cars.
- Schedule package deliveries when you are going to be home or have them delivered to a trusted neighbor, relative, temporary PO Box, your job or at your condo or apartment offices. (if they allow it). Amazon Hub is a resource to consider for a safe delivery option.
- Keep gifts out of sight of windows or leave the curtains closed.
- Always lock your doors and windows, even if you plan to be out for a short while. Also make sure doors and windows will still lock with any Christmas light extension cords running through them.
- Set your home alarms and make sure the monitoring company has your current phone numbers.
- Don't "advertise" your new high-dollar purchases after the holidays. Break down the boxes of TVs, stereos, computers, etc. Turn them inside out or cut them up before putting them in the trash or recycling. Look for cardboard recycling dumpsters. Thanks Ken and Celebration Sanitation!
- Document and photograph the model and serial numbers of electronic or high valued items for later reference.
- DO NOT run extension cords across sidewalks or cover the streetlights outside your homes. You may be sued for someone being injured if someone trips as a result. Damages to the streetlight poles could also be billed to you.



#### **SHOPPING SAFETY TIPS**

#### LOCK YOUR CAR DOORS!

- Keep full attention on your surroundings. A distracted person is especially vulnerable to attackers. Have your keys handy to enter your car.
- Park in well-lit areas or ones that will have lighting when you exit the mall after a day of shopping
- Put packages in locked trunks and out of view. Thieves do their own form of window shopping, looking in parked cars for gifts and other merchandise. Keep your receipts with you.
- Carry purses strategically with zippers closed and large openings facing towards you.
- · Put wallets in front pockets or zippered in coat linings
- Keep large amounts of cash hidden. Robbers love those who like to show off their wads of cash and will follow you until the opportunity to strike happens.
- Use caution and be aware at ATM's. Avoid an ATM in an isolated or dimly lit area and look for skimmers.
- If shopping alone, request store security, an employee or a manager to escort you to your car. If that's not possible, wait until another shopper exits the store. Remember there is usually safety in numbers.

#### **VACATION SAFETY TIPS**

- Many people take trips this time of year and leave their homes. Make sure all doors and windows are secure and properly locked. Set your alarms. Have a trusted friend, neighbor or relative periodically check your home. A few additional tips are listed below.
- The Osceola County Sheriff's Office can also be contacted using the non-emergency number of 407-348-2222. Advise the dispatcher that you would like to request "vacation checks" of your home. They will obtain information from you and your request will be sent to the deputies working in the area to conduct extra patrols when possible. This is a free service.
- Lights, a radio and/or televisions can be put on timers to give your home an occupied appearance. Make sure to adjust timers to accommodate the earlier sunsets
- Avoid "broadcasting" to everybody on social media that you will
  be gone. It's nice to brag about the two week trip to Iceland, but
  criminals are tech savvy and use all forms of social media to check
  when you'll be gone. Plus I'll bet that you probably don't know all the
  friends of friends that may have access to seeing your itinerary.
- Finally, delay posting pictures on social media until you return home.

I don't consider myself a bearer of bad news. I think of it as spreading reality in hopes of reducing crime and helping you make sound decisions at all times, especially this time of year. There is never a guarantee of you never being a victim, but by taking some extra precautions and watching your surroundings, we hope to reduce those chances. I hope you all have a crime free, happy and healthy holiday season. Please stay safe. •





### Local author publishes biography on local hero



"Colonel" is US Army Colonel William Arthur Connelly's life story. It is both heartbreaking and heartwarming, filled with childhood and personal memories, difficulties with dyslexia, WWII, and US Army experiences.

Penned by new author, Patricia McGoldrick, she is a resident and local realtor of Celebration since 2004. She retired four years ago and is enjoying writing; "Colonel" is her first published biography. "Writing Col. Connelly's story taught me about a different world, an unfamiliar one, and I am grateful I had the opportunity to learn and write about his life," expressed McGoldrick.

This is US Army Colonel William Arthur Connelly's life story of living through the Great Depression and beyond. His loving mother passed away when he was six years old, then his childhood became a string of one sadness after another. He was abandoned shortly after his mother died, and he was later raised on a farm overseen by the Society to Prevent Cruelty to Children. As a young adult he was drafted into the US Army, he stormed Omaha Beach on D-DAY, and served as both an enlisted man and then as an Officer. He was a member of Counterintelligence and earned his way through the ranks to become a US Army Colonel. His life has been and is a continual battle to conquer his dyslexia. A true American, Colonel Connelly is always making the best of his life. He has overcome obstacles and struggles which have resulted in his many achievements and profound accomplishments.

Col. Connelly is 96 years old and has breakfast every morning with two other WWII veterans in Celebration. He is one of the last survivors of D-Day. His memory of June 6, 1944 is that "D-Day was a horrific day of bloodshed and deafening screams. Though the pain of my war years has lessened, my memories of climbing the cliffs, of all the men we couldn't save and all the men we lost stay with me today."

A soldier for 27 years, he made a career in the military. Most of his Army life was spent working with CIC, Counterintelligence. After being promoted through the Army ranks, he retired as a US Army Colonel, one of the highest and most respected offices in our country. Originally, from Pennsylvania, he now calls Celebration home.







# WHAT ARE THOSE ELECTRIC CHARGERS BEHIND TOWN HALL?

Earlier this year I joined Mike Jackson, Debie McDonald and a number of other Celebration residents as an owner of an electric vehicle (EV). EVs are increasingly making a lot of practical sense, especially for Celebration households. If you will be contemplating the purchase or lease on a new vehicle in the next year or so, here's why you might want to consider an EV.

Types of Electric Vehicles. There are three types of electric vehicles: a) hybrid (HEV): conventional internal combustion engine plus electric motor, the electric motor's battery recharges itself through energy dissipated during braking; b) plug-in hybrid (PHEV): a hybrid that recharges the electric batteries by plugging into an electrical outlet; and c) all-electric battery (BEV): powers itself entirely by one or more electric motors, no gasoline or diesel-powered engine, it recharges itself by plugging into an electrical socket.

**Brief History.** EVs are nothing new. William Morrison's 4-horsepower, 24-cell-battery, front wheel drive car was a sensation at the 1893 Chicago World's Fair. But by the 1920s, gasoline-powered cars had won the technology war. Gasoline engine cars were much cheaper, gasoline was plentiful and inexpensive and while drivers could refill a gasoline powered engine in a matter of minutes, recharging batteries was difficult and could take hours if not days.

The auto companies, General Electric and even NASA (the lunar rover) tinkered with electric cars over the years, but old-fashioned battery technology, very limited range and lack of a recharging infrastructure held back successful widespread sale and use of new EVs.

Enter the innovative lithium ion battery. Tesla and their principal investor Elon Musk put their electric motor and lithium ion batteries into a 2008 British sports car and later in 2011 models. Despite the \$109,000 price tag, this got some other companies thinking. Nissan introduced its plug-in Leaf in 2011. Chevrolet came to market with its Spark in 2016.

However, credit goes to Elon Musk and Tesla, which changed



the name of the electric vehicle game. Tesla solved two major problems associated with PEVs: the range problem with an innovative lithium ion battery and the infrastructure problem with a nationwide system of Tesla-only recharging "pumps" at gas stations and Walmarts. That finally woke up the major auto companies and they have been racing to catch up ever since.

**Vehicle choice and price.** There are more new EVs for sale at Central Florida dealerships than you might think, including 35 plug-in hybrids and 19 all-electric BEV's (**evadoption.com/ev-models/bev-models-currently-available-in-the-us/**). They range in price from the Hyundai Ioniq at about \$27,000 to the Bentley Bentayga at \$166,000.

Electric-powered light trucks are coming as well. Ford has begun pre-production of its F-150 Lightning and already has 100,000 orders. The GM Hummer is slated to be available in early 2022 and the highly publicized and radical-looking Tesla Cybertruck is expected in 2023.

Now, EVs are generally more expensive than comparable gasoline-powered vehicles. But there's a \$7500 federal tax credit for buyers of new EVs, except for Tesla and General Motors (which have exceeded the number of vehicles sold that was specified in the original tax credit legislation).

Charging locations and cost. Electricity is not free. BEV owners have three recharging alternatives: a) Level 1: ordinary 120-volt household current; b) Level 2: 240-volt current at home (the same used for electric ovens and dryers); and c) Level 3 (DC Fast): public high-voltage charging stations, operated by four companies in competition with each other.

After I personally found Level 1 charging too slow and Level 3 too expensive, I had an electrician install a Level 2 240-volt line in my garage. I plug in my Mustang Mach E each evening, and by morning it is fully charged with a range of about 220 miles, (an extended range option has a 300-mile range). Using the rates on my Duke Energy bill, I calculated my cost of operation at about \$.03 per mile. If I were driving a vehicle getting 25 miles per gallon and with a gasoline price at \$2.99 per gallon, that's about \$0.14 per mile. Consequently, electric propulsion costs me 1/3 that of a conventional gasoline or diesel powered vehicle. And I save money because there's no oil to change.

The author "pumps" electricity into his all-electric vehicle at the charging stations behind Town Hall. The stations are provided by Duke Energy, and the fee is about the same as charged Celebration residents for their residential electricity.

Further, starting in January, Duke Energy customers will be able to register for a new Off Peak Electric Vehicle Charging Credit, thus saving more money. See duke-energy.com/newrates.

Suppose I want to get a quick charge at a local public charging station. Conveniently, there are two such stations in the rear parking lot of the Celebration Town Hall (851 Building) and several more at the library; the fee is about what I pay Duke Energy for my residential service, \$0.15 per kWh. For Mike Jackson and his Tesla, there are Tesla-only charging stations at the Bohemian Hotel and eight DC Fast Chargers behind Applebee's. For Debie McDonald and other non-Tesla owners, there are charging stations at the AdventHealth Celebration Hospital parking garage and the Melia Hotel, as well as 24 on Disney World property. Download the PlugShare app or the Department of Energy App (www.energy.gov/) to find Level 2 and Level 3 DC Fast Charge station locations anywhere in the USA.

Range. Some people prefer hybrid electrics because they also have a gasoline engine that can be quickly refueled on a long trip. However, an all-electric is not as limiting as you might think. Suppose I want to drive to Atlanta, 450 miles away. No problem. My Mustang Mach E displays all the public charging stations along the route. Fast charge stations will take the Mach E's charge from 10% to 80% in 35 minutes, about the time to get a meal or wander around Walmart. That gets me another 165 miles of vehicle range. So, with two 35-minute stops, I'm in downtown Atlanta. Not quite as convenient as an internal combustion engine (ICE) or a hybrid, but not bad.

Of the new BEVs available today, range on a single charge goes from 110 miles for the \$30,000 Mini Cooper to 405 miles for the \$79,000 Tesla S Long Range. Most are in the 200s.

Where are the batteries? Like most other BEVs, my Mustang Mach E has an array of 10 battery modules, side-by-side, roughly 4 inches high, located under the passenger compartment. Charging time and battery temperature are sensitively related, faster charging time could increase battery temperature to dangerous levels. To their credit, GM has been quick to market with a number of EVs. As a matter of caution, GM is recalling all of its Chevrolet Bolt BEV small sedans, which could have dangerously high battery temperatures and in some cases actual fires; fixing them involves new onboard diagnostic software and/or new redesigned battery modules.

There's no question that EV's are the wave of the future. All the auto companies predict that most if not all their new vehicles will be electric by 2040 if not sooner. In 20 years, our grandchildren will be sitting with us on our front porches, sipping lemonade, and asking, "Why in the world did you drive those smelly, noisy, dangerous, complicated gasoline-powered cars?"

# CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Island Village offers a fresh and unique take on the New Urbanism ideals that Celebration originally made famous The following is a brief update on construction progress at Island Village.

With site development for Phase One now complete, townhomes and single-family homes are under construction. Several homes are complete, with Island Village's first homeowners already enjoying their new surroundings. Progress on amenities is well under way, with a clubhouse currently under construction by Streetlights Residential. Two promenades are also under construction around the ponds. A fitness trail with equipment is being installed around the water's edge, as well as a yoga lawn and scenic seating areas.

Conceptual planning for a proposed elementary school has begun. Picturesque Celebration Boulevard is now being beautified, with solar streetlights scheduled for installation soon — the first of their kind in Celebration. Meanwhile, Island Village's alleyways (which residents will use to access their rear garages) will also boast their own new variety of solar streetlights using innovative wraparound solar panels.

Looking ahead, site planning for Phase Two of Island Village is now under review by The Celebration Company and Osceola County. •

# Sawdust By Veryl Kroon

If you are a regular reader of these articles then you will already know that I am big advocate for customization in wood projects, especially furniture. Why? Because we are all individuals in varying size, likes & dislikes, for the aesthetic as well as the functional fit in its future surroundings, and how things function. In this article, we are going to look at some retrofitted wood items in addition to projects that were created to fill a need.











- # 1 is a cuckoo clock where the roofline was looking a little bare so the light-colored wood is a carved addition that fits the motif and gives a fuller and more completed look to the clock. A matching paint to the existing clock and the viewer will never suspect the clock has been enhanced.
- #2 is a camelback clock where on the left you see the original key-wind mechanical works that are worn to the point where it would no longer run. In the center, you see the cabinet that has a light colored wood addition to accommodate a new and very accurate battery Quartz clock works on the right.
- #3 shows the camelback clock back together with the Quartz works looking much the same as the original clock.
- # 4 is a new artist canvas-painting easel that is adjustable to accommodate most any sized stretched canvas an artist would want to work on. It is made of hard maple so strong and stable with no wobbling during work sessions. It was also designed with storage or transporting in mind and folds up so it is only seven inches thick at the widest part.
- # 5 is a custom corner table so the chair projects out from a corner at angle for the perfect reading
- corner. The shape of the table gets the light shining right where it is needed. The table is just the right height for this chair so the reader can also enjoy a beverage or a pencil for writing in the margins while reading.
- # 6 is an iPad raised stand for digital meetings on Zoom, Microsoft Teams, or Apple FaceTime. The shelf is convenient for reference materials or note taking supplies.



The annual jazz and blues concert was very enjoyable and we were lucky to listen to three wonderful groups that serenaded us as we picnicked and lounged in our chairs on the beautiful grounds. This month's lecture presentation will be on bonsai trees. A local expert showed us the intricacies in growing these miniature trees that can live for hundreds of years! The meeting will be held in Heritage Hall on November 17, 9 a.m. All are welcome to attend and if you like, join the club. Dues are \$30 a year, \$40 for a couple and can be paid online while you check out the rest of our website at celebrationgardenclub.com.

We are happy to be holding our first Poinsettia sale right now. We are selling four sizes of plants that are available in red and white colors along with a special color called Ice Crystal. Now that November is here, what should be thinking about planting in our gardens right now? Here are a few ideas.

**VEGETABLES:** Beet, broccoli, Brussels sprouts, cabbage, carrot, v, celery, Chinese cabbage, collard, endive, kale, kohlrabi, lettuce, mustard, onion, pea, radicchio, radish, rhubarb, rutabaga, spinach, Swiss chard and turnip.

**FLOWERS:** Ageratum, alyssum, baby's breath, black-eyed Susan, bush daisy, calendula, California poppy, candytuff, carnation, cat's, chrysanthemum, cleome, cornflower, delphinium, dianthus, dusty miller, foxglove, gaillardia, geranium, goldenrod, heliotrope, hollyhocks, Iceland poppy, impatiens, larkspur, lobelia, ornamental cabbage & kale, pansy, petunia, phlox, salvia, shasta daisy, snapdragon, stock, sweet pea, verbena, viola and wax begonias.

**HERBS:** anise, arugula, basil, borage, chive, cardamon, chervil, cilantro, coriander, dill, fennel, garlic, ginger, lavender, lemon balm, lovage, Mexican tarragon, mint, nasturtium, oregano, parsley, rosemary, sage, sweet marjoram, thyme and watercress.

Thank you for keeping our town looking so beautiful. It is always a pleasure to hear visitors say how nice our yard plantings look.







# **CELEBRATION FOUNDATION ESTABLISHES** THE ROCKING CHAIR MEMORIAL

Tom Lewis was the first person hired by Peter Rummell, President of Disney Development Company, to work on the Celebration project. In 1987, Tom was Secretary of the Florida Department of Community Affairs when he got a call from Peter asking him to "take on the most significant, complicated damn planning assignment you've ever faced." In 1987, a full 7 years before ground was broken, Tom became the Director of Community Development. Tom led the effort to get local and state support for Celebration and the realignment of highway 417. Even more difficult was getting The Disney Company to agree to move forward with Celebration. It wasn't until 1991 that Tom and Peter were able to convince Disney to build Celebration. Tom and his wife Cynthia loved Celebration, built a home on Golfpark Drive and became active in the community helping to build Community Presbyterian Church. Tom passed away in 2019.

Dorothy Johnson moved to Celebration in 1996 at the age of 81. She was a librarian and when she moved to Celebration made it her passion to pass along her love of reading to this community. In 2002, she inspired Mary McMahon to convert a

14x14-storage space at Lakeside Park into a makeshift library. Mary and Dorothy's advocacy for a public library led to the temporary library at Water Tower Place in 2006 and several years later to our permanent library. In to her 90's, Dorothy would still lead story time readings for young kids at the library. Dorothy was also active in supporting the arts. She had a wonderful collection of African art, supported the Celebration Foundation Concert Series and supported many efforts to bring quality jazz music to Celebration. Dorothy symbolized one of the great hopes of Celebration - which Celebration would be a community for all ages that we would have the opportunity to interact and learn from people of all ages and regardless of age; you could be active and engaged in the community. Most people's memory of Dorothy is watching her ride her 3-wheel cycle all through town well into her 90's. Dorothy passed away still living in Celebration at the age of 100 in 2015.




