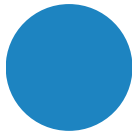

Good Standing

As a **resident of good standing** in Celebration, you are entitled to **attend community events, activities and utilize parks, pools, and playgrounds**. Many areas have a security access gate that requires scanning of your **Celebration ID card**.

ID Cards



The **ID cards are non-transferable** and have your photo printed on them. **ID cards may be obtained at Town Hall**. All residents, 12 and older, are able to get an ID card with an embedded chip that allows access to the pools. Residents under 12 years of age can obtain a card that has their photo on it without the embedded chip.



Tenants

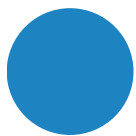
If you are a **tenant in Celebration**, a lease is required in order to obtain an ID. Your card's expiration date is the end date of your lease.

Guest Policy



A resident with a valid CROA ID may bring no more than four non resident guests outside of their immediate family on any given occasion unless under a scheduled event, private party, etc.

The ID holder must remain with the guest(s) at all times. In order to avoid conflicts or disappointments, please contact Town Hall if you are having a party in one of the parks or playgrounds.



Lakeside Parking

Vehicles parking at Lakeside Park are required to have a Celebration sticker. These decals are free and can be obtained at Town Hall.

TRASH & IRRIGATION



Trash Schedule

Trash needs to be within 4 feet of the alley or curb before 7 a.m. on the scheduled day.

Recycle bins are to be kept in your garage except on the scheduled trash day.

Recycling - Wednesday for all villages

Glass (bottles and jars only), Aluminum cans (no scrap metal or foil type material), Bi metal cans (soup, vegetable cans and alike), Clean cardboard (no take out or delivery pizza boxes), Loose, sorted paper. (No napkins or paper towels), Plastic bottles and containers # 1,2,4,5 only. Please, no plastic bags of any kind and please discard all screw caps and lids. All materials must be in a closed recycling container with a lid.



Yard Waste Day - Thursday for all villages

Yard waste is no longer accepted in any type of plastic bags. Place waste in up to four (4) 32 gallon containers that are clearly marked "Yard Waste" stenciled on both sides, in paper yard waste bags, or you can use your regular totter as well, just leave the lid open on Wednesday's. If yard waste is not disposed of properly, it will not get collected.

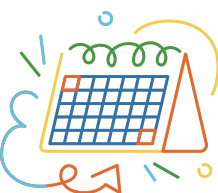

Town Hall

Q: I have a tree that needs to be trimmed, who does that?

A: If it's in the easement it would be the CCDD, as they will trim the tree facing the road side to ensure safety guidelines are followed. If it's in the home's yard, it is the owner's responsibility. You can put the request in for easement trees via your My Celebration FL app.

Q: I have a street light out, who do I call?

A: The CCDD at 407-566-1935. You can also put the request in via your My Celebration FL app.

Q: Where do I get a condo parking sticker or report that something is wrong with my condo?

A: Your condo management company.

Q: Where can I make my HOA payments?

A: You can mail them, pay them at Town Hall (851 Celebration Avenue), or pay online through the resident portal.

Q: I have a maintenance question, but am unsure who to contact?

A: You can always submit your request through the [My Celebration FL](#) app. Once the request is submitted, it will be directed to the appropriate department and you will receive status updates regarding the request until the issue is resolved.

Q&A CONTINUED...

Finance

Q: When are Celebration Residential Owners Association (CROA) assessments due?

A: Assessments are due on the first of each calendar quarter: January, April, July and October 1. Payments are considered late if the payment is not posted to the account by the 30th of the month that it is due.

Q: What does my CROA assessment pay for?

A: Your CROA payment maintains all of the common areas that we all share equally such as the community pools, parks, landscaping, facility maintenance, etc.



ARC Committee

Q: What types of projects require prior approval from the ARC?

A: Any change on the exterior of the property requires approval. For example, painting the home, changing landscaping, replacing the mailbox, altering house numbers, any change to fencing (including adding or removing). It is better to obtain written approval – even for very minor projects – than find later the changes were not approved and have become a violation of the Covenants.

Q: How can I determine possible paint colors for my home or the types of plants suitable for my yard?

A: The ARC has created many simple information packets which answer these questions and many others. Topics available include exterior painting, flags and flagpoles, fencing, landscaping, swimming pools, etc. Additional topics are added as the needs of Celebration owners change.

Q: Where can I obtain documents such as the Celebration Community Charter, ARC Meeting Schedule, or Design Guidelines for a specific topic?

Town Hall

Celebration Town Hall houses the offices and personnel responsible for the Celebration Residential Owners Association, Celebration Nonresidential Owners Association and the Celebration Joint Committee. Together, these organizations regulate property use and provide maintenance and operation for a number of common facilities, including landscaping, parks, and playgrounds.

Town Hall serves several roles in the Celebration community as follows,

- Serves as a clearing house for resident issues.
- Staff provides community information and coordination among the community associations, Development Districts and The Celebration Company.
- Community services such as recreational programs and program registration, special events, common area maintenance, community meetings, newsletters, administration of community covenants, conditions and restrictions, administration of architectural review process, regulate property use, trash collection, architectural review requests, pool passes, community network passwords, information by phone or in person, coordinating security/community service representatives and public law enforcement officers.

Town Hall is comprised of the following departments: Administration, Resident Services, Community Standards, Service Areas, Information Technology, Communications and Lifestyle, Parks and Recreation, and Maintenance.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS & TOWN HALL TEAM

CROA Board of Directors

Per the By-Laws, the Board of Directors, Celebration Residential Owners Association, Inc., is comprised of seven (7) owners who serve three-year staggered terms. Board members may serve two consecutive terms. Sense of Place

All people have a universal need for stimulating experiences and social interaction. Providing a variety of unique "places" throughout Celebration, where this type of activity would continually occur, was an important Cornerstone behind its creation. "Places" take on many forms at Celebration. A comprehensive master plan provides the foundation for place-making throughout town. Signature buildings designed in some of the world's greatest architectural styles provide timeless character to residential neighborhoods.

Focus on Technology

From the beginning, Celebration has embraced technology as an essential means of connecting people. To accommodate future advancements, Celebration is prepared to evolve with technology as it changes, helping to ensure that technology will continue to do exactly what it is intended, to bring people together.

Focus on Education

Celebration has placed education at the heart of its vision in the belief that lifelong learning provides an essential key to a higher quality of life. In 1995 education began at The Learning Academy, a public education system recognized by the Florida Department of Education with a 2000-2001 Five Star School Award. Currently, educational opportunities include KinderCare, The Montessori Academy, Island Village Elementary, Celebration K-8, Celebration High School, Foreign Language Emersion School, and Creation Village World School.

Focus on Health

Good health is the key to a good life. So, at Celebration, the Cornerstone of Health focuses first on prevention and caring for the whole person – mind, body and spirit. Numerous amenities, parks, and trails encourage people to get out and stay active. A state-of-the-art AdventHealth facility and comprehensive Fitness Center is located within the community further support Celebration's commitment to health and well-being.

HISTORY

In the early 1990s, the Disney Development Company (DDC) established the Celebration Company to spearhead its development within approximately 4,900 acres of land in the southern portion of the Reedy Creek Improvement District. Total investment for the project is estimated at US \$2.5 billion.

The master plan was developed by Cooper, Robertson & Partners and Robert A. M. Stern, and the extensive landscape, parks, trails and pathways were designed by the San Francisco firm EDAW (now AECOM). Celebration is planned in an early 20th-century architectural style and is not zoned for high-density residences. Celebration was named the “New Community of the Year” in 2001 by the Urban Land Institute.

The first phase of residential development occurred in the summer of 1996 with Celebration Village, West Village and Lake Evalyn; this was followed by the North Village, South Village, East Village, Aquila Reserve and the final Artisan Park phases. Disney CEO Michael Eisner took an especially keen interest in the development of the new town in the early days, encouraging the executives at Disney Development Company to “make history” and develop a town worthy of the Disney brand and legacy that extended to Walt Disney’s vision of an Experimental Prototype Community of Tomorrow (EPCOT). DDC executives collaborated extensively with leaders in education, health and technology in addition to planners and architects to create the vision and operating policies for the town.

Celebration has successfully combined education, health, community, technology and architecture into a community with a strong sense of self. World-renowned architects designed Celebration to be a new and exciting place to live, work and play.

Celebration Village, West Village and Lake Evalyn were Celebration's first phase of development, with a total of approximately 500 home sites, including 76 townhomes, and nearly 700 condominiums. The second phase of residential development was North Village, with more than 300 homes sites and 300 condominiums, followed by South Village with over 600 home sites and townhomes and nearly 500 condominiums. Phase four was East Village and Aquila Reserve with a combined 500 homes and townhomes and 70 condominiums.

Artisan Park is a 160-acre village built by St. Joe Company and contains more than 600 homes and condominiums. The addition of residences at Spring Lake, along with the accompanying amenity center, has enabled the community to grow, yet still keep that small-town feel. Additions of Emerson and Astoria along Celebration Boulevard provide yet another residential option. The architecture blends traditional, southeastern exteriors with floor plans and interiors that are designed for modern lifestyles and tastes. Homes, most with welcoming front porches, encourage activity in the front yard. Most residences have rear access to the garage by means of a service alley. Community and architectural guidelines were developed by Urban Design Associates, in conjunction with Robert A.M. Stern Architects and Cooper.

Island Village is the latest development of the world-renowned community of Celebration, and will feature more than 1,000 homes. Generous green parks and thoughtful gathering spaces, beautiful pool amenities, premium recreation centers and walking and biking trail networks make up the Island Village lifestyle.



Osceola County was created in 1887. Osceola County is a 1,506 square mile area that serves as the south/central boundary of the Central Florida Region and the Greater Metropolitan Area. The City of Kissimmee, the County Seat, is 18 miles due south of Orlando. Osceola's only other incorporated City, St. Cloud, is nine miles east of Kissimmee, and approximately 45 miles west of the City of Melbourne on the Atlantic Coast.
